“Understanding the Trinity: Who Is the Holy Spirit?”

SCRIPTURE REFERENCE: 2 Corinthians 13:14

Guest Speaker: Pastor Maurice Tuff

Summary

Pastor Maurice Tuff discussed the Holy Spirit's role within the Trinity, emphasizing the distinct yet interconnected functions of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. He highlighted the importance of understanding the Trinity for a steadfast faith and clear doctrine. Pastor By exploring John 14:26 and 2 Peter 1:16-21, Pastor Maurice illustrated the Holy Spirit's role as the Comforter and teacher. He stressed that the Holy Spirit guides believers in understanding and applying biblical truths. He also encouraged the congregation to deepen their relationship with the Holy Spirit through prayer and study, aiming for a sound understanding of the Trinity.

Understanding the Trinity

- Pastor Maurice discussed the importance of having a steadfast conviction in one's beliefs about the Trinity to truly understand the Holy Spirit.
- He uses the example of a family to illustrate the concept of oneness within the Trinity. He explains that just like a husband and wife are not physically one, but represent a oneness in their relationship, the members of the Trinity - God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit - are individual persons, but they represent a spiritual oneness.
- Pastor Maurice emphasizes that the key is understanding the difference between "one" and "oneness". The Trinity is not about a physical, singular oneness, but a spiritual oneness where the three persons of the Godhead work in unity, harmony and shared character, just as a family does.

The Role of the Holy Spirit

- The Holy Spirit is the Comforter and the one who brings to remembrance what Jesus taught.
- The Holy Spirit guides believers and helps them to understand the Bible.
- The Holy Spirit is sent by the Father to teach and guide believers in the absence of Jesus.
- The Holy Spirit guides believers in their spiritual journey and helps them stay in line with God's will.
- Without the Holy Spirit, it would be difficult for believers to properly interpret and apply the Bible

The Holy Spirit as the Tutor and Teacher

- The Holy Spirit is sent to be the tutor and teacher for believers and helps believers understand sound doctrine and apply it to their lives.
- The Holy Spirit prevents believers from being easily swayed by false interpretations or teachings
- Believers must allow the Holy Spirit to guide their thoughts, words, and actions so that they are in alignment with God's will.

- 2 Corinthians 13:14 - The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Ghost, be with you all. Amen.
- John 14:26 - But the Comforter, which is the Holy Ghost, whom the Father will send in my name, he shall teach you all things, and bring all things to your remembrance, whatsoever I have said unto you.
- John 17: 5, 21- 26 - So now, Father, glorify me in your own presence with the glory that I had in your presence before the world existed....As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us,[f] so that the world may believe that you have sent me. **22** The glory that you have given me I have given them, so that they may be one, as we are one, **23** I in them and you in me, that they may become completely one, so that the world may know that you have sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me. **24** Father, I desire that those also, whom you have given me, may be with me where I am, to see my glory, which you have given me because you loved me before the foundation of the world. **25** "Righteous Father, the world does not know you, but I know you, and these know that you have sent me. **26** I made your name known to them, and I will make it known, so that the love with which you have loved me may be in them and I in them.
